Protect your Versa paperless slate with this durable, magnetic case covered with high grade synthetic leather.

Exclusively designed to fit the Versa slate and protect it from wear and tear, you can read and write on your Versa without removing it from the case.

When closed, the case leaves the writing cells exposed and the reading cells covered. To use both sides of the Versa, simply release the magnetic clasp to open the flap.

The Versa is held in the case by magnets, which can also be used to attach the slate to a fridge or similar surface.

To attach the slate to the case, position the case with the opening facing down and the flap facing you. Then place the slate on the case with the reading side facing up and the stylus to your left. The magnets will gently pull the slate into position.

### Up to eight reminders to remember





Whether you need reminders for a short course of antibiotics or for long-term medication regimes, this talking pocket clock can help to make sure you never miss a dose.

Set up to eight daily alarms to remind you when your tablets, eye drops or injections are due.

The clock is radio-controlled (UK and US only) which means the time and date are set automatically by radio signal (time can be set manually in other parts of the world, but may require sighted assistance). This also means the clock will automatically update when the clocks change in the spring and the autumn, and therefore means you should never have to change the time manually unless out of the signal range.

It has two English voice settings (male and female), two clock settings (12-hour or 24-hour) and speaks the time at the press of a large button. (Press twice to hear the date.)

When the battery is low, the LCD shows a blinking low battery icon. The voice, signal reception and backlight functions will not operate.

This pocket clock has a black front and white back with contrasting buttons (white buttons on the front, black buttons on the back). It is supplied with a carabiner clip and a lanyard, and can be used as a keyring.

### Four legs good!

This clever task lamp with a rotating LED panel and four folding legs makes it easy to direct bright light where you need it for work, rest, and play.



The legs are attached to the lamp head with elastic cord to make assembly easy, and the LED panel rotates through 300 degrees so you can direct the light without obstructions or shadows. You can also use the power button to dim the light by fifty per cent if required.

With an IPX64 waterproof rating, and weighing less than 400g, the work lamp is a great portable light for use anywhere, and it folds away when not in use to save space too.

This task light is also rechargeable, so there are no cables to get in the way while you're reading, crafting or completing a crossword. In addition to the mini-USB charging port, the light has a USB-A port which can be used to turn the light into a power bank for charging a phone or tablet if needed. The ports have a rubber cover when not in use to keep the light waterproof.

While charging, a red light will show through the opaque lens. This light will turn green once charging is complete. The light charges fully in two hours and gives 2.5 hours of light (200 lumens, 5,400k) per charge.

Okay, breathe through the contractions and you'll master your braille course in no time at all... (Of course, unlike giving birth, strong contractions in braille are probably the easiest ones to get to grips with!)

To make it easier to learn (and teach) braille, we've put two more of our braille reading schemes on USB stick, so you can emboss or print pages as you need them.

We're also launching the second half of the Read Write Inc phonics book set and introducing the SENSEE braille learning kit for children aged three and up.



#### Dot-to-Dot for sighted learners on USB

Dot-to-dot is a self-teach uncontracted braille course. This version of the course is designed for people learning to read braille by sight, for example, teachers. (For people learning braille because of sight loss, there is a touch learners pack available.)

This USB memory stick contains the braille and the print files for the complete Dot-to-Dot for sighted learners scheme. It is for use with a computer – please note, it does not contain audio files.

Compared with the touch learners pack, the Dotto-Dot sight learners pack takes a quicker route at the early stages, as reading braille by sight is considerably easier than reading by touch. However, you're encouraged to work through the pre-braille skills in Book 1 using touch, as this will help you appreciate the skills involved, especially if you go on to support touch learners.

This pack teaches the complete uncontracted braille code and uses plenty of reading and writing activities to consolidate learning.

The course has a heavy emphasis on the practical use of braille from the start and includes tactile braille booklets. You can also download a free dotted cell practice sheet from the Online Shop (go to Users Guides on the product page).

#### Hands On on USB

Getting Hands On with braille has never been easier.


Our first stage braille reading scheme, Hands On, is now available on a USB stick.

The five-level course, designed for a young child, introduces the alphabet and alphabetic word signs, strong contractions, a few short forms, numbers 1 to 10, basic punctuation, and capitals, over 32 practice books, plus a booklet of fun activities and several real stories at each level. (Hands On does not introduce the full contracted braille code – for that see our second stage scheme, Take Off (TC21413-USB).)



#### **Read Write Inc**

Read Write Inc (RWI) is a structured, synthetic phonics-based literacy programme that teaches reading, writing and spelling. It is aimed at children aged four to seven, but many braille learners may benefit from using the programme beyond age seven. The RWI programme consists of two parts – phonics sounds lessons and storybook lessons.

We have produced braille versions of the RWI storybooks for braille learners. These storybooks incorporate pages of uncontracted (grade one) braille into a print book, so that braille learners can read with a sighted peer.

We launched the first four book levels in the series last year, now you can complete the set as we launch levels five to eight.

The books can be used alongside phonics sounds lessons, in which the child learns to read and write the braille letters while learning the sounds that the letters represent. Once they have learnt enough letters and sounds, they can complete storybook lessons using the RWI braille storybooks, developing their fluency, comprehension and writing skills.

The RWI uses a different approach to teaching literacy from traditional braille reading schemes such as 'Hands On', in that it focuses on teaching children to decode words using phonic knowledge.

The RWI books are divided into eight levels (each containing 10 books), marked by different coloured bands, from red (1) to grey (8). The complete order is: red, green, purple, pink, orange, yellow, blue, grey.

#### Energrid audible power banks

These power banks use sounds and vibration patterns to indicate different battery levels. They will also tell you when you've successfully connected with a device or with a power source when being recharged. Choose between an audible and/or vibratory alert by simply pressing and holding the power button for two seconds.

Charging starts automatically after connection and stops when the phone, or other device, is fully charged.

The power bank has three USB ports – each marked with one, two or three tactile dots to make it easier to identify – micro-USB/USB-B in, USB-C in and out, USB-A out. It is supplied with a USB-C to C charging cable which can be plugged in either way up.

### **Portable magnifiers with BIG ideas**

The Luna S is a pocket-sized magnifier packed with features, including voice control and an FM radio. You can also use the Luna S to keep up with **The Archers** or play Popmaster, thanks to the built-in FM radio. Turning the radio feature on and tuning to your favourite station is quick and easy.

If the history book on your shelf is always repeating itself, let us tempt with you some new examinations of times past...

In **Catholics** (807368), Roy Hattersley presents a sweeping account of Catholics in the British Isles from the Reformation to the present day. Described by the **Guardian** as "a tale of high drama and high stakes, by turns horrifying, romantic and ultimately hopeful", this book tells the stories of the recusants, those who refused to abandon their allegiance to the pope in the post-Reformation religious havoc.

Christopher Haigh also tackles the Reformation in **English Reformations** (807376). Described as a "lively and readable study", in it Haigh sets out to recreate the sixteenth century as a time of excitement and insecurity, with each new policy or ruler causing the reversal of earlier religious changes.

It's a good month for fans of the Reformation, as we also have **Henry VIII and the English Reformation** (807370) by the aptly named Richard Rex. This analytical account sets out the logic of Henry VIII's short-lived Reformation.

And if you still haven't had your fill of Terrible Tudors, there's John Guy's **Tudor England** (801657), described as "a compelling account of political and religious developments from the advent of the Tudors in the 1460s to the death of Elizabeth in 1603".

Finally, with ne'er a Tudor in sight, we have **Tales of the Old Countrymen** by Brian P Martin (807379), which describes the colourful and eventful lives of 13 humble countrymen, from the tough times of Edwardian England to the relative comforts of today. Spend time with the mole-catcher, beekeeper and hurdle-maker as you discover how rural life has changed.

If you prefer biography and autobiography, we have plenty for you to enjoy.

In Jane Haining: A Life Of Love And Courage (807372), Mary Miller tells the story of a Scottish farmer's daughter who worked as a matron at the Scottish Jewish Mission School in Budapest from 1932 and refused to leave the children when Hungary was invaded by the Nazis.


**The Desert Fathers** (807371) tells the stories of devout Christians in the fourth century and "opens a window onto early Christianity". By contrast **Diana: Closely Guarded Secret** (807380) by former Metropolitan Police Royalty Protection Branch officer Ken Wharfe reveals the truth about the Princess's relationships; accounts of exotic trips around the world; Diana's desire to escape the 'gilded cage' of royalty; how Charles and Diana managed their separate love lives with the help of loyal retainers; and an indictment of the errors in security and protection that led to the Princess's death.

#### In Memories of a Village

**Rectory** by Sheila M Farrance (807373), Fanny Woolgar, records her time, from 1913 to 1922, as a parlourmaid at Speldhurst Rectory in Kent. This book vividly describes a world that has now almost disappeared – one in which domestic staff and ordinary village folk worked long and arduous hours in the service of the gentry.

Monica Baldwin's autobiography I Leap Over the Wall (807378) explores her life in one of the oldest and most strictly enclosed contemplative orders of the Roman Catholic Church – and her life on leaving the convent aged 48 in 1941.

Other new non-fiction titles recently released include: **Mary Berry's Baking Bible: Over 250 Classic Recipes** (807367); **The Reiki Manual: A Training Guide for Reiki Students, Practitioners, and Masters** by Penelope Quest (807374);



The Supreme Awakening: Experiences of Enlightenment Throughout Time – And How You Can Cultivate Them by Craig Pearson (807375); and Lucid Dreams In 30 Days: The Creative Sleep Program by Keith Harary (807377).

We also bring you the four-book Zack Walker series by Linwood Barclay, a **New York Times** bestselling author with twenty novels to his credit, and who counts Stephen King among his fans.

**Bad Move** (805714) introduces reluctant hero Zack Walker, a science fiction writer and perpetually worried father who moves his family from the dangerous city to the peaceful suburbs and runs headlong into the law of unintended consequence. The Walker family's change of scene doesn't bring about tranquillity, but it does introduce them to political corruption, a marijuana-growing operation, the neighbourhood dominatrix, and murder.

Zack also has to make it through Bad Guys (805715), Lone Wolf – published in the UK as Bad Luck (805716), and Stone Rain – published in the UK as Bad News (805717)!
