Enjoy out-of-this-world art with this space-themed tactile colouring pack.



Like all our tactile colouring packs, the 10 raised images can be coloured in using colouring pens, pencils, crayons or paint.


The images are printed (black outlines on white) as well as being tactile. Each page is also titled in uncontracted braille and print.

Pages are loose leaf (unbound) which allows them to be shared, or easily displayed in your household art gallery (whether that's on the fridge, noticeboard or kitchen door).



Nicky and her white cane Candy just want to navigate their street, but there are quite a few obstacles in their way... **Nicky and Candy's Street** shows how small things can become big barriers for blind or partially sighted people. Follow Nicky and Candy as they learn about changes we can all make to ensure Better Places for all.

Written by Ben Andrews and illustrated by Charlotte Jenkins, this wirobound book is suitable for ages six to eight years.

Staying in touch can be simplicity itself...

Designed to be uncomplicated, Emporia V27 Simplicity 4G mobile phones do exactly what it says on the tin – they keep things simple and are as easy to use as one, two, three.





Available in a bar phone (HM97) or clamshell (HM98) style, the Simplicity is all about making it easy for you to keep in contact with your friends and loved ones. The generous two-inch screen displays text that is large, bold and adjustable. Both the display and backlit keypad use high contrast white text against black to make them easier to see. The start and end call buttons are clearly marked with green and red icons.

Three direct memory buttons allow you to quickly dial your most-used numbers, meaning help is never too far from reach.

The extra-large illuminated and raised buttons have an excellent pressure point, and the phone has loud and clear audio that is suitable for the hard of hearing, as well as a vibration alert.

When the emergency call button is pressed, up to five pre-defined contacts will be called until someone answers. The phone will automatically go into loudspeaker mode and a prepared emergency SMS will be sent to an emergency number. In addition, a loud alarm tone will simultaneously sound to draw the attention of anyone in the vicinity to the emergency situation.

Other features include: radio, alarm, calendar, calculator, and three alert profiles (silent/sleep – visual notifications only; meeting/theatre – visual notifications and vibrations; maximum/bus mode – key tones, SMS tone and vibration function activated, ringtone volume set on maximum).

Please note, these phones are 4G-only and not compatible with network THREE, which only works on 3G, or the MVNOs (mobile virtual network operators) that THREE supports – Smarty, ID, Freedompop, and Cntrl Mobile.

Powerful notetakers for school, work and home



The BrailleSense 6 and 6 Mini are HIMS' most powerful notetakers yet. Traditional looks – a 32-cell or 20-cell braille display and a nine-key Perkins-style keyboard (including Control, Alt and function keys) – are combined with competitive, modern hardware and connectivity to create a device that is slimmer, lighter, faster and more efficient.

Built-in apps allow you to create documents, send and read email, browse the web, play DAISY and other media, manage your contacts and calendar, search and download books, and manage databases.

Not only are these notetakers powerful productivity tools, they also promote braille literacy through their braille-centric command structure. In addition they support Google Apps such as Google Drive, Google Docs, Google Sheets, Google Slides and Google Classroom; ensuring students and professionals can be intuitively

productive and efficiently collaborative in the contemporary world.

You can download more apps, including Zoom, Google Meet, Microsoft Teams, Apple Music, Amazon Kindle, or any other accessible app, via Google Play. And stay connected, professionally or personally, via YouTube, X (formerly Twitter), Facebook, WhatsApp, or other platforms.

Use the built-in 13 megapixel camera, or connect an external USB camera to join online meetings with video. External camera support also makes batch scanning print materials especially convenient.

You can also use the notetakers' proprietary apps to create TXT, RTF, DOCX and DOC, BRF, and more. You can also access PPT and PPTX, XLS and XLSX, PDF, EPUB, XML and HTML, as well as DAISY books and media files in all standard formats.

In addition, these notetakers offer an intuitive and automatic interface for electronic braille maths, via UEB, Nemeth, or computer braille, including equation creation and editing in the Word Processor, and scientific and graphics calculators.

Both the BrailleSense 6 and 6 Mini allow visual collaboration with parents, teachers, and colleagues, who can view the notetaker's screen via the USB C port, which can connect to and power portable HDMI monitors, or mirror the screen to another Android tablet.

Welcome back the Micro-Speak!

This popular digital voice recorder is back and with design tweaks to make it even easier to use.

Combining smart design with ease of use and high-quality performance, it's packed with useful features including tactile buttons, spoken prompts and beeps to assist blind and partially sighted users.

Record instantly with the press of a button, and playback immediately via the built-in speaker. High quality recording in MP3 format ensures impressive results for a variety of applications.

The new Micro-Speak Plus has a larger power switch, more tactile buttons, and an SD card slot. The audio prompt software has also been improved, and the mini-USB socket has been changed to the more user-friendly USB-C type. A 1GB micro SD card is also included, which provides 15 hours of recording time.

Use the Micro-Speak Plus to record voice memos and reminders, create shopping lists, list telephone numbers and emergency contacts, and for organising appointments and events.

As well as easy-to-use, simple navigation, the Micro-Speak Plus provides spoken prompts and beeps to aid blind and partially sighted users with

recording, deleting files, detecting

battery level, and more.

The built-in microphone records high quality MP3s with a 128kbps sample rate, and the built-in speaker provides high quality audio playback. You can also plug in headphones for personal listening.

Function buttons – record, play/ pause, next, previous and volume control – are all large and tactile.

Hark AI has a lot to offer

Looking for a reading solution that can also describe images and read barcodes? The Hark AI might fit the bill.



This reading machine is the popular Hark Reader with a few extras under the proverbial bonnet. Like the original, Hark AI can scan and read letters, magazines, books, menus and medicine instructions, but it can also read handwriting, describe images, translate documents into another language, and read barcodes.

Simple to use, the Hark AI will read any printed information you place on it (from 6pt to 72pt font, up to A4 size – larger items, like newspapers, can be read if folded) in your choice of natural human-sounding voice and at the speed and volume you choose. It can also describe images and read handwriting, so you can have a birthday card fully described, for example.



It has a 3.5mm headphone jack which can be used for headphones to give you privacy or a hearing loop, if you wear a compatible hearing aid. There is also an optional keypad to support more in-depth navigation.

Hark AI can be connected to a wi-fi network by following the automated instructions. The connection process will only need to be followed once upon initial setup. Connection will happen automatically afterwards.

A tactile pause button can be found on the front of the device, but you can also pause reading by waving your hand over the text (wave again to resume reading).

A second tactile button lets you skip back one or two sentences to listen to something again.

All controls, including the sliding volume control and the buttons to increase and decrease reading speed, are tactile, black and contrast with the white case of the Hark AI.

Hark AI folds away when not in use and is supplied with a carrying case.


